





# CYGNET COLOUR RUSH DK BRICK STITCH SHAWL CY1685

### Materials -

2 x 100g balls of Cygnet Colour Rush DK in Calypso 650

Small about of Pato 999 in White for trim and tassles

4 mm crochet hook

Piece of cardboard to make tassels

#### Pattern notes -

UK terminology used

This pattern is an easy 2 row repeat

The size of the shawl can be made longer or shorter by making rows.

## Abbreviations explained -

The chain 1 does not count as a stitch

The chain 4 counts as a treble crochet and chain 1

Cluster – work 3 treble crochet into the same stitch or space.

Peak – to work the peak – 3 treble crochet + chain 1 + 3 treble crochet all into the chain 1 space from the row before

Abbreviations -	sk – skip	t – turn your work	peak from the row
tr – treble crochet	st(s) - stitch(s)	fo – fasten off yarn	before
dc – double crochet	tur – turning	nxt – next	bet – between
ch(s) - chain(s)	cl(s) - cluster(s)	peak – cl + ch 1 + cl	sp(s) – space(s)

Make a magic ring, or alternatively ch 4 and slst to join into a ring

Row 1 – into ring work, ch 4 + cl + ch 1 + cl + ch 1 + tr, tighten ring

Row 2 – ch 1, t, into 1st ch sp work dc + ch 3 + dc (1st chlp made), ch 3, into ch 1 peak, ch 3, into last ch 1 sp work dc + ch 3 + dc (last chlp made)

Row 3 – ch 4, t, into 1st chlp cl, cl into ch 3 sp, peak, cl into nxt ch 3 sp, into last chlp ch cl + ch 1 + tr (6 cls)

Row 4 – ch1, t, into 1<sup>st</sup> ch sp work dc + ch 3 + dc, [ ch 3, dc into sp bet cls ] twice, ch 3, peak, [ ch 3, dc into sp bet cls ] twice, ch 3, into last ch sp dc + ch 3 + dc

Row 5 – ch 4, t, into 1st chlp cl, [ cl into ch 3 sp ] 3 times, peak, [ cl into ch 3 sp ] 3 times, into last chlp ch cl + ch 1 + tr (10 cls)

Row 6 – ch1, t, into 1<sup>st</sup> ch sp work dc + ch 3 + dc, [ ch 3, dc into sp bet cls ] 4 times, ch 3, peak, [ ch 3, dc into sp bet cls ] 4 times, ch 3, into last ch sp dc + ch 3 + dc

Row 7 – ch 4, t, into 1st chlp cl, [ cl into ch 3 sp ] 5 times, peak, [ cl into ch 3 sp ] 5 times, into last chlp ch cl + ch 1 + tr (14 cls)

Row 8 – ch1, t, into 1<sup>st</sup> ch sp work dc + ch 3 + dc, [ ch 3, dc into sp bet cls ] 6 times, ch 3, peak, [ ch 3, dc into sp bet cls ] 6 times, ch 3, into last ch sp dc + ch 3 + dc

Row 9 – ch 4, t, into 1st chlp cl, [ cl into ch 3 sp ] 7 times, peak, [ cl into ch 3 sp ] 7 times, into last chlp ch cl + ch 1 + tr (18 cls)

Row 10 - ch1, t, into 1<sup>st</sup> ch sp work dc + ch 3 + dc, [ ch 3, dc into sp bet cls ] 8 times, ch 3, peak, [ ch 3, dc into sp bet cls ] 8 times, ch 3, into last ch sp dc + ch 3 + dc

Repeat the last 2 rows increasing by 4 clusters every 2nd row.

Continue until you reach you desired length, ending with a block row


### Trim –

With right side facing attach white yarn into ch 4 sp, ch 1, \* dc into sp, ch 3, dc into sp bet cl sts \*, rept from \* to \* till you reach the peak, into the ch 1 of the peak work dc + ch 1 + dc, ch 3, rept from \* to \* ending with a dc into the ch 4 sp, fo

#### To make tassels - Make 3

- Cut a piece of cardboard 6 " in height
- Cut 6 lengths of yarn, slightly longer than the height of your tassel
- Wrap your yarn around the cardboard 15 times
- Slip one piece of yarn though the centre and tie tightly at the top
- Slide the tassel off the cardboard and lay flat on top of a piece of yarn that is laying horizontal
- Tie tightly around about 2 cm from the top
- Use a darning needle to feed these lengths though the centre to blend them in
- Use the 1st length tied at the top. to attach to the shawl on all 3 corners
- Use a darning needle to feed these lengths back down though the centre to blend them in
- Trim Neatly

Weave in all ends
