### Sprinkles Pop Chunky Granny Square Scarf

#### Measurements

Finished scarf measures 250cm x 17cm

#### Materials

Cygnets Sprinkles Pop Chunky 641 Lavender Honey, 3 x 100g balls

7mm crochet hook

## Abbreviations

<b>ch</b>	Chain	<b>sl-st</b>	Slip Stitch
<b>tr</b>	Treble Crochet	<b>mc</b>	Magic circle
<b>st</b>	Stitch		

## Notes

This pattern uses the 'Join as you go' (JAYG) technique to join the squares. After the first square, you will join each consecutive square on the 5<sup>th</sup> round.

If you don't want to start each square with a magic circle you can chain 4 and slip stitch into the 1<sup>st</sup> chain, this will create the loop you work into in rnd 1.

## Pattern

**Rnd 1:** Make a mc, ch3 (this always counts as a tr), working into the mc tr 2, ch2, \*tr3, ch2; repeat from \* twice more, sl-st to top of ch3.

**Rnd 2:** ch3, (3tr, 2ch, 3tr) into the next 3 ch2 spaces, (3tr, 2ch, 2tr) into the last ch2 space, sl-st to top of ch3.

**Rnd 3:** ch3, 2tr into same space, \*work (3tr, 2ch, 3tr) into next 2ch space, 3tr into next space; repeat from \* twice more, (3tr, 2ch, 3tr) into last ch2 space, sl-st to top of ch3.

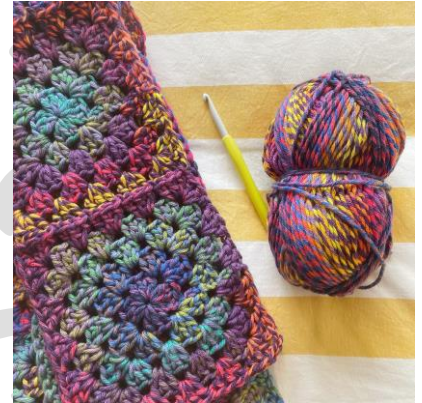
**Rnd 4:** ch3, 3tr into next space, \*(3tr, 2ch, 3tr) into ch2 space, 3tr into next 2 spaces; repeat from \* twice more, (3tr, 2ch, 3tr) into last ch2 space, 2tr into next space, sl-st to top of ch3.

**Rnd 5:** ch3, 2tr into same space, 3tr into next space, \*(3tr, 2ch, 3tr) into ch2 space, 3tr into next 3 spaces; repeat from \* twice more, (3tr, 2ch, 3tr) into next ch2 space, 3 tr into next space, sl-st to top of ch3, fasten off and sew in ends.

Make 12 more squares, follow rnd 1 – 4 for each square and then join squares together on the 5<sup>th</sup> round using the JAYG method.

Alternatively, you could make all 13 squares and then sew them together at the end.

Once you have joined all 13 squares you will need to sew the top of the first square to the bottom of the last square, being careful not to twist the scarf. Lay it flat, sew it together to create a continuous loop.



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
