REQUIREMENTS

Fabrics from the Britannia collection:

1. A344.1 - Royal Britannia on Cream - $\frac{3}{8}$ yd - 40cm
2. A344.2 - Royal Britannia on Blue - $\frac{7}{8}$ yd - 80cm
3. A345.1 - Union Jack Hearts on Cream - fat $\frac{1}{4}$

4. A345.3 - Union Jack Hearts on Black - fat $\frac{1}{4}$
 5. A346.1 - Metallic Gold Crowns on Cream - $\frac{3}{8}$ yd - 40cm
 6. A346.3 - Metallic Silver Crowns on Red - $\frac{3}{8}$ yd - 40cm
 7. A347.1 - Soldiers on Cream - $\frac{3}{8}$ yd - 40cm
 8. A347.2 - Soldiers on Blue - fat $\frac{1}{4}$
 9. A348.2 - Clock Face on Blue - $\frac{1}{2}$ yd - $\frac{1}{2}$ mtr
 10. A348.3 - Clock Face on Grey - fat $\frac{1}{4}$
 11. BB184 - Bumbleberries Post Box Red - 1yd - 1mtr
- Wadding and backing 55" x 55"

Use $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance throughout. Press all seams as you go

Cutting

From fabric 1 cut

1 x 8" x 8" (centre of block)

20 x 3" x 3" (corners of border number 1)

From fabric 2 cut

2 x 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 45 $\frac{1}{2}$ " (you will need to join your strips to get the length, sides)

2 x 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 51 $\frac{1}{2}$ " (as before, top and bottom)

From fabric 3 cut

2 x 4 $\frac{5}{8}$ " x 4 $\frac{5}{8}$ " cut in half diagonally once (for block)

4 x 3 $\frac{1}{8}$ " x 3 $\frac{1}{8}$ " (for block)

4 x 3" x 3" (for border number 2)

From fabric 4 cut

4 x 6 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 6 $\frac{1}{4}$ " cut in half diagonally twice (for border number 3)

4 x 4 $\frac{5}{8}$ " x 4 $\frac{5}{8}$ " cut in half diagonally once (for block)

From fabric 5 cut

4 x 6 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 6 $\frac{1}{4}$ " cut in half diagonally twice (for border number 3)

From fabric 6 cut

4 x 3" x 15 $\frac{1}{2}$ " (for border number 1)

From fabric 7 cut

4 x 3" x 30 $\frac{1}{2}$ " (for border number 2)

From fabric 8 cut

4 x 3" x 15½" (for border number 2)

From fabric 9 cut

16 x 5⅞" x 5⅞" cut in half diagonally once (for border number 3)

From fabric 10 cut

4 x 3" x 15½" (for border number 2)

From fabric 11 cut

2 x 5⅞" x 5⅞" cut in half diagonally once (for border number 3)

7 x 6¼" x 6¼" cut in half diagonally twice (for border number 3)

16 x 3" x 3" (for border number 1)

2 x 5" x 5" cut in half diagonally twice (for block)

2 x 4⅝" x 4⅝" cut in half diagonally once (for block)

Making up the quilt

Lay out the fabric for the block



Centre block

Stitch the two triangles together to make a square. Sew 4 in total

Next stitch the small triangle to the square on one side, press and then the other triangle to the square. Sew 4 in total. Now sew in rows and then sew the rows together to make the square.

Border 1



Corner block

Stitch the squares together to make the block, stitch 4 in total.

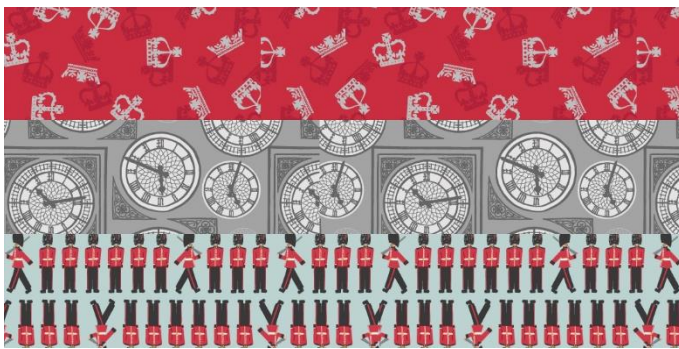


Diagram block for border 1

Stitch the strips together to make the border strip, stitch 4 in total. On two of the strips sew a square each end. Stitch the two strips without the squares on them to the sides and then sew the other strips onto the block top and bottom.

Border 2

Stitch two of the strips to the sides of quilt. Next sew the small squares to each end of the last two strips, sew them to the top and bottom of quilt.

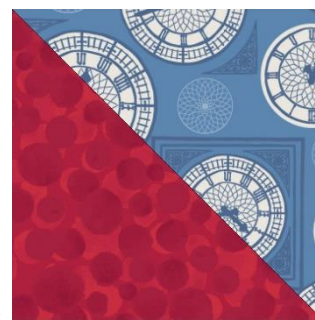

Diagram blocks for border 3

- Corner block -

Lay out the fabric pieces for each of the blocks as in the main diagram.

Sew the small triangles together and then sew this to the large triangle to make a square. For blocks A you need to make 14 in total and blocks B the same number.

The corner blocks.

Stitch the two triangles together to make the square, sew four on total.

Lay out all the blocks as in the main diagram. Stitch them together to make the strips. Sew two of the strips to the quilt sides and on the other two strips stitch the corner squares to each end. Sew them to the quilt top and bottom.

Border 4

Sew the strips $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $45\frac{1}{2}$ " to the sides and the last two strips to the top and bottom.

Quilting

Sandwich quilt top, wadding and backing together. Quilt by hand or machine as desired. Trim backing and wadding to size.

Binding

Use your favourite method from fabric 11 to bind the quilt.

1. A344.1 - Royal Britannia on Cream - $\frac{3}{8}$ yd - 40cm
2. A344.3 - Royal Britannia on Grey - $\frac{7}{8}$ yd - 80cm
3. A345.2 - Union Jack Hearts on Grey - fat $\frac{1}{4}$

4. A345.1 - Union Jack Hearts on Cream - fat $\frac{1}{4}$
5. A346.2 - Metallic Gold Crowns on Dark Blue - $\frac{3}{8}$ yd - 40cm
6. A346.1 - Metallic Gold Crowns on Cream - $\frac{3}{8}$ yd - 40cm
7. A347.3 - Soldiers on Grey - $\frac{3}{8}$ yd - 40cm
8. A347.1 - Soldiers on Cream - fat $\frac{1}{4}$
9. A348.2 - Clock Face on Blue - $\frac{1}{2}$ yd - $\frac{1}{2}$ mtr
10. A348.1 - Clock Face on Light Gold - fat $\frac{1}{4}$
11. BB94 - Bumbleberries Light Grey - 1yd - 1mtr

Wadding and backing 55" x 55"

Use $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance throughout. Press all seams as you go

Cutting

From fabric 1 cut

1 x 8" x 8" (centre of block)

20 x 3" x 3" (corners of border number 1)

From fabric 2 cut

2 x 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 45 $\frac{1}{2}$ " (you will need to join your strips to get the length, sides)

2 x 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 51 $\frac{1}{2}$ " (as before, top and bottom)

From fabric 3 cut

2 x 4 $\frac{5}{8}$ " x 4 $\frac{5}{8}$ " cut in half diagonally once (for block)

4 x 3 $\frac{1}{8}$ " x 3 $\frac{1}{8}$ " (for block)

4 x 3" x 3" (for border number 2)

From fabric 4 cut

4 x 6 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 6 $\frac{1}{4}$ " cut in half diagonally twice (for border number 3)

4 x 4 $\frac{5}{8}$ " x 4 $\frac{5}{8}$ " cut in half diagonally once (for block)

From fabric 5 cut

4 x 6 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 6 $\frac{1}{4}$ " cut in half diagonally twice (for border number 3)

From fabric 6 cut

4 x 3" x 15 $\frac{1}{2}$ " (for border number 1)

From fabric 7 cut

4 x 3" x 30 $\frac{1}{2}$ " (for border number 2)

From fabric 8 cut

4 x 3" x 15½" (for border number 1)

From fabric 9 cut

16 x 5⅞" x 5⅞" cut in half diagonally once (for border number 3)

From fabric 10 cut

4 x 3" x 15½" (for border number 1)

From fabric 11 cut

2 x 5⅞" x 5⅞" cut in half diagonally once (for border number 3)

7 x 6¼" x 6¼" cut in half diagonally twice (for border number 3)

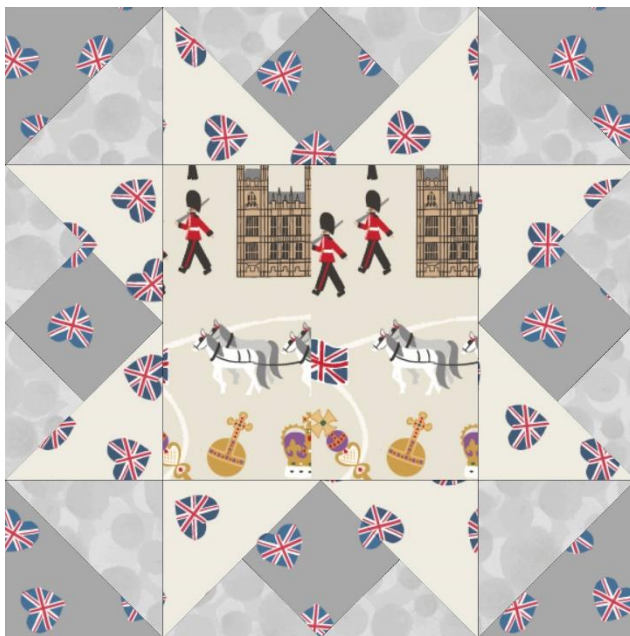
16 x 3" x 3" (for border number 1)

2 x 5" x 5" cut in half diagonally twice (for block)

2 x 4⅝" x 4⅝" cut in half diagonally once (for block)

Making up the quilt

Lay out the fabric for the block



Centre block

Stitch the two triangles together to make a square. Sew 4 in total

Next stitch the small triangle to the square on one side, press and then the other triangle to the square. Sew 4 in total. Now sew in rows and then sew the rows together to make the square.

Border 1



Corner block

Stitch the squares together to make the block, stitch 4 in total.

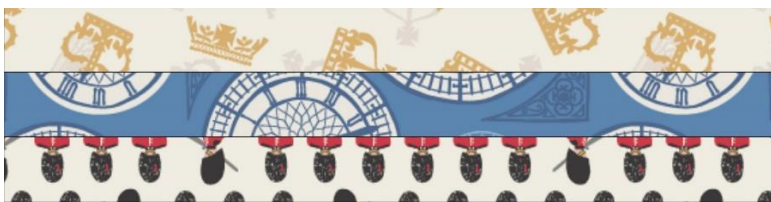


Diagram block for border

Stitch the strips together to make the border strip, stitch 4 in total. On two of the strips sew a square each end. Stitch the two strips without the squares on them to the sides and then sew the other strips onto the block top and bottom.

Border 2

Stitch two of the strips to the sides of quilt. Next sew the small squares to each end of the last two strips, sew them to the top and bottom of quilt.

Border 3



Diagram blocks for border 3

- Corner block -

Lay out the fabric pieces for each of the blocks as in the main diagram.

Sew the small triangles together and then sew this to the large triangle to make a square. For blocks A you need to make 14 in total and blocks B the same number.

The corner blocks.

Stitch the two triangles together to make the square, sew four on total.

Border 4

Sew the strips $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $45\frac{1}{2}$ " to the sides and the last two strips to the top and bottom.

Quilting

Sandwich quilt top, wadding and backing together. Quilt by hand or machine as desired. Trim backing and wadding to size.

Binding

Use your favourite method from fabric 11 to bind the quilt.
