



Honey Bee Throw 1

Designed and made by Sally Ablett Size of throw 46" x 46" - unfinished block size $20^{1/2}$ " x $20^{1/2}$ "size

Requirements

Fabrics from the Honey Bee collection:

- 1. A653.3 Clover on charcoal ½yd
- 2. A651.2 Leaves on warm lavender ½yd
- 3. A654.2 Metallic gold bees on British green 3/8yd
- 4. A500.3 Beehive on dark cream with gold metallic ½vd
- 5. A652.2 Gold metallic starburst on fawn ½yd
- 6. BB40 Cream 1yd

Wadding and backing 50" x 50"

All measurements include ¼" seam allowances; press each seam as you go.

Cutting

From fabric 1 cut

16 x 5¼" x 5¼" cut in half diagonally twice (border 5 on block)

16 x 2½" x 2½" (border 5 on block)

From fabric 2 cut

 $8 \times 1\frac{3}{4}$ " x $16\frac{1}{2}$ " top & bottom (border 4 on block)

8 x 1¾" x 14" sides (border 4 on block)

8 x 1½" x8½" top & bottom (border 1 on block)

8 x 1½" x 6½" sides (border 1 on block)

From fabric 3 cut

8 x 5¼" x 5¼" cut in half diagonally twice (border 2 on block)

16 x 2½" x 2½" (border 2 on block)

9 x 2½" x 2½" (in between sashing)

From fabric 4 cut

4 x 6½" x 6½" (block center)

4 x 5¼" x 5¼" cut in half diagonally twice (border 2 on block)

16 x 2 7/8" x 2 7/8" in half diagonally once (border 2 on block)



Blocks

From fabric 5 cut
12 x 2½" x 20½" (sashing)
From fabric 6 cut
12 x 5¼" x 5¼" cut in half diagonally twice
(border 5 on block)
16 x 2 7/8" x 2 7/8" in half diagonally once (border 5 on block)
8 x 1¼" x 14" top & bottom (border 3 on block)
8 x 1¼" x 12½" sides (border 3 on block)

Making up the block

Lay out the fabric pieces as in the block diagram. Sew the strips of fabric 2 to the center piece of fabric 4, sides and then the top and bottom. Next stitch border 2 together, Adding a square each end of the top and bottom strips. Sew the sides to the block and then the top and bottom. Border 3 stitch the sides to the block from fabric 6 and then the top and bottom. Do the same to border 4. Border 5 is made up in the same way as border 2. Sew 4 blocks in total.

Complete the quilt

Lay out the sashing, squares and blocks as in the main diagram.

Rows 1,2 and 3. 5 rows in total.

Stitch the top row together pressing the seams one way and then on the next row the other way. This helps when sewing all your blocks together.

Quilting

Sandwich quilt top, wadding and backing together. Quilt by hand or machine as desired. Trim backing and wadding to size of quilt.

Binding

Use your favourite method from fabric 6 to bind the quilt.

Honey Bee Throw 2

Designed and made by Sally Ablett Size of throw 46" x 46" - unfinished block size $20^{1/2}$ " x $20^{1/2}$ "size

Requirements

Fabrics from the Honey Bee collection:

- 1. A653.1 Clover on natural ½yd
- 2. A651.3 Leaves on green ½yd
- 3. A654.3 Metallic gold bees on charcoal 3/8yd
- 4. A500.4 Beehive on fawn with gold metallic ½yd
- 5. A652.1 Gold metallic starburst on dark cream ½yd
- 6. BB318 Heather 1yd

Wadding and backing 50" x 50"

All measurements include ¼" seam allowances; press each seam as you go.

Cutting

From fabric 1 cut

16 x 5¼" x 5¼" cut in half diagonally twice (border 5 on block)

16 x 2½" x 2½" (border 5 on block)

From fabric 2 cut

 8×134 " x 1612" top & bottom (border 4 on block)

8 x 1¾" x 14" sides (border 4 on block)

8 x 1½" x8½" top & bottom (border 1 on block)

8 x 1½" x 6½" sides (border 1 on block)

From fabric 3 cut

8 x 5¼" x 5¼" cut in half diagonally twice (border 2 on block)

16 x 2½" x 2½" (border 2 on block)

9 x 2½" x 2½" (in between sashing)

From fabric 4 cut

4 x 6½" x 6½" (block center)

4 x 5¼" x 5¼" cut in half diagonally twice (border 2 on block)

16 x 2 $\frac{7}{8}$ " x 2 $\frac{7}{8}$ " in half diagonally once (border 2 on block)



Blocks

From fabric 5 cut
12 x 2½" x 20½" (sashing)
From fabric 6 cut
12 x 5¼" x 5¼" cut in half diagonally twice
(border 5 on block)
16 x 2 7/8" x 2 7/8" in half diagonally once (border 5 on block)
8 x 1¼" x 14" top & bottom (border 3 on block)
8 x 1¼" x 12½" sides (border 3 on block)

Making up the block

Lay out the fabric pieces as in the block diagram. Sew the strips of fabric 2 to the center piece of fabric 4, sides and then the top and bottom. Next stitch border 2 together, Adding a square each end of the top and bottom strips. Sew the sides to the block and then the top and bottom. Border 3 stitch the sides to the block from fabric 6 and then the top and bottom. Do the same to border 4.

Border 5 is made up in the same way as border 2. Sew 4 blocks in total.

Complete the quilt

Lay out the sashing, squares and blocks as in the main diagram.

Rows 1,2 and 3. 5 rows in total.

Stitch the top row together pressing the seams one way and then on the next row the other way. This helps when sewing all your blocks together.

Quilting

Sandwich quilt top, wadding and backing together. Quilt by hand or machine as desired. Trim backing and wadding to size of quilt.

Binding

Use your favourite method from fabric 6 to bind the quilt.

Honey Bee Throw 3

Designed and made by Sally Ablett Size of throw 46" x 46" - unfinished block size $20^{1/2}$ " x $20^{1/2}$ "size

Requirements

Fabrics from the Honey Bee collection:

- 1. A653.2 Gold metallic starburst on dark grey ½yd
- 2. A651.1 Leaves on dark cream ½yd
- 3. A654.1 Metallic gold bees on dark cream 3/8yd
- 4. A500.5 Beehive on dark grey with gold metallic ½yd
- 5. A652.3 Gold metallic starburst on dark grey ½yd
- 6. BB311 -Indigo 1yd

Wadding and backing 50" x 50"

All measurements include ¼" seam allowances; press each seam as you go.

Cutting

From fabric 1 cut

16 x 5¼" x 5¼" cut in half diagonally twice (border 5 on block)

16 x 2½" x 2½" (border 5 on block)

From fabric 2 cut

 $8 \times 1\frac{3}{4}$ " x $16\frac{1}{2}$ " top & bottom (border 4 on block)

8 x 1¾" x 14" sides (border 4 on block)

8 x 1½" x8½" top & bottom (border 1 on block)

8 x 1½" x 6½" sides (border 1 on block)

From fabric 3 cut

8 x 5¼" x 5¼" cut in half diagonally twice (border 2 on block)

16 x 2½" x 2½" (border 2 on block)

9 x 2½" x 2½" (in between sashing)

From fabric 4 cut

4 x 6½" x 6½" (block center)

4 x 5¼" x 5¼" cut in half diagonally twice (border 2 on block)

16 x 2 7/8" x 2 7/8" in half diagonally once (border 2 on block)



Blocks

From fabric 5 cut
12 x 2½" x 20½" (sashing)
From fabric 6 cut
12 x 5¼" x 5¼" cut in half diagonally twice
(border 5 on block)
16 x 2 7/8" x 2 7/8" in half diagonally once (border 5 on block)
8 x 1¼" x 14" top & bottom (border 3 on block)
8 x 1¼" x 12½" sides (border 3 on block)

Making up the block

Lay out the fabric pieces as in the block diagram. Sew the strips of fabric 2 to the center piece of fabric 4, sides and then the top and bottom. Next stitch border 2 together, Adding a square each end of the top and bottom strips. Sew the sides to the block and then the top and bottom. Border 3 stitch the sides to the block from fabric 6 and then the top and bottom. Do the same to border 4. Border 5 is made up in the same way as border 2. Sew 4 blocks in total.

Complete the quilt

Lay out the sashing, squares and blocks as in the main diagram.

Rows 1,2 and 3. 5 rows in total.
