## Requirements

Fabrics from the Tulip Fields collection:

1. A458.3 - Windmills on Light Slate - fat $1 / 4$
2. A459.1 - Two Tone Tulip Light Blue - fat $1 / 4$
3. A460.3 - Mouse Tulip on Yellow - fat $1 / 4$
4. A461.1 - Tulips on Cream - fat $1 / 4$
5. A462.1-Tulip Fields on cream long $1 / 4$

Wadding 22" x 22"
Backing fabric for cushion -60 cm
20" x 20" cushion pad

## All measurements include $1 / 4$ " seam allowances

## Cutting

From fabric 1 cut - $1 \times 81 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 81 / 2 "$ (centre of block)
From fabric 2 cut $-2 \times 11 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 12^{1 / 2 "}$ (each sides of block) $2 \times 1 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times 14 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ (top \& bottom of block)
From fabric 3 cut $-1 \times 21 / 2{ }^{\prime \prime} \times 81 / 22^{\prime \prime}$ (top of block) $1 \times 21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 12^{112} 2^{\prime \prime}$ (left side of block)

From fabric 4 cut $-2 \times 21 / 2 " \times 101 / 2 "$ (left side and bottom of block)

From fabric 5 cut $-2 \times 31 / 21 \times 141 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ (sides of block)

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2 \times 31 / 2 " \times 201 / 2 " \text { " (top \& bottom of block) }
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Making up the cushion top. This is based on quilt-as-you-go. Place your square of fabric 1 onto the centre of the wadding. Pin into place, now take fabric 3 strip for the top of the cushion pin into place and stitch down. Now do the same to fabric 4 . Sew this to your centre square, press back. keep going around the centre square until you have all four strips sewn to the centre. So, you will stitch fabric strips 3,4,4 and the last one will be 3

Next the strips of fabric $2-1 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times 12^{1} 22^{\prime \prime}$. With right sides together place a strip to each side of the square, sew and then press back. Next do the same to the top and bottom strips.
Now the last four strips, sides and then the top and bottom. You can add a bit more quilting to you cushion if you like.
Cut two, $131 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 201 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles from the backing fabric.
Make a double fold to wrong side along one long edge on each backing rectangle and stitch in place.

Place cushion front right side up on work surface. Lay one backing rectangle right side down on top, aligning raw edges at bottom edge and sides. Add second backing rectangle on top, right side down and aligning raw edges at top edge and sides. Pin in place. Folded edges should overlap by several inches at centre.

Stitch around all four edges.
Turn right side out and insert a 20" cushion pad.
