

## LION BRAND® LANDSCAPES® TILTED BLOCKS COWL

### EASY

### SIZE

**Finished Circumference** About 45 in. (114.5 cm)

**Finished Height** About 8 in. (20.5 cm)

### MATERIALS

- LION BRAND® LANDSCAPES® (Art. #545)
  - #213 Meadow 1 ball (A)
  - #211 Coral Reef 1 ball (B)
- LION BRAND® crochet hook size K-10.5 (6.5 mm)
- LION BRAND® large-eyed blunt needle

### GAUGE

3 blocks = about 4 1/2 in. (11.5 cm).

BE SURE TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE.

### NOTES

1. Cowl is worked in one piece, beginning with a foundation row, then joining to work in the round.
2. Starting with a Foundation Row makes it easier to join on Rnd 1 without twisting.
3. Yarn color is changed on every round.
4. To change yarn color, insert hook into stitch indicated. Yarn over with new color and draw through all loops on hook to complete the stitch. Proceed with new color. Carry color not in use up wrong side of the Cowl.

### COWL

With A, and leaving a long yarn tail, ch 211.

**Foundation Row:** With A, work 3 dc in 4th ch from hook (3 skipped ch count as dc – first block made), sk next 3 ch, sc in next ch, \*ch 3, dc in next 3 ch (block made), sk next 3 ch, sc in next ch; rep from \* across – you will have 30 blocks at the end of this row.

### Join to work in the round

With B, and being careful not to twist, join with sl st in ch-3 sp of first block.

**Rnd 1:** With B, ch 3 (counts as first dc), turn, 3 dc in first sc (first block made), \*sk next 3 dc, (sc, ch 3, 3 dc) in next ch-3 sp (block made); rep from \* around, sc in top of beg ch, change to A in last st and join with sl st in turning ch.

**Rnd 2:** With A, rep Rnd 1, change to B in last st and join with sl st in turning ch.

**Rnds 3-10:** Rep Rnds 1 and 2.

**Rnd 11:** Rep Rnd 1.

Fasten off.

## **FINISHING**

With beginning yarn tail, sew ends of Foundation Row together.

Weave in yarn ends.

beg = begin(ning)(s)

ch = chain

ch-sp = chain space previously made

dc = double crochet

rep = repeat

rnd(s) = round(s)

sc = single crochet

sk = skip

sl st = slip stitch
