### What you will need:

RED HEART® Soft®: 1 ball 00012 Grey


Crochet Hook: 3.75mm [US F-5]

Stitch markers (optional), yarn needle

TENSION/GAUGE: 15 sts = 10 cm [4"]; Rows 1–11 = 7.5 cm [3"].  
CHECK YOUR TENSION/GAUGE.  
Use any size hook to obtain the tension/gauge.

## Back Loop & Front Loop Square

### For Checkerboard Textures Throw

*Use this square for making the one-colour Checkerboard Textures Throw. Follow our blog by searching LW4132EN. If you feel creative, use this stitch pattern for your own unique crochet project.*

Square measures 25.5 x 25.5 cm [10 x 10"].

#### Note

Square is worked back and forth in rows beginning at lower edge.

### SQUARE 7

#### Back Loop and Front Loop Square

Ch 36 loosely.

**Row 1 (right side):** Working in back loop of each ch only, dc in 2nd ch from hook and in each remaining ch across, turn—35 dc.

**Row 2:** Ch 1, dc in back loop of first st, \*dc in front loop of next st, dc in back loop of next st; repeat from \* across, turn.

**Row 3:** Ch 1, dc in front loop of first st, \*dc in back loop of next st, dc in front loop of next st; repeat from \* across, turn.

**Rows 4–39:** Repeat last 2 rows 18 more times.

**Row 40:** Repeat Row 2.

**Row 41:** Ch 1, working in both loops, dc in each st across, do NOT turn.  
Do not fasten off.

**Border Round (right side):** Ch 1, working in ends of rows down side edge, work 33 dc evenly spaced across side edge; working across opposite side of foundation ch and working into both free loops of each ch, (dc, ch 3, dc) in first ch (first corner made), dc in each remaining ch across to last ch, (dc, ch 3, dc) in last ch (2nd corner made); work across next side edge in same manner as first side edge; working across sts of Row 41, (dc, ch 3, dc) in first st (3rd corner made), dc in each st across to last st, (dc, ch 3, dc) in last st (4th corner made); join with slip st in first dc—140 dc (35 dc across each side edge) and 4 corner ch-3 spaces. Fasten off.

**Note:** To work 33 dc evenly spaced across each side edge, the designer recommends working as follows: Place a marker in each end of Rows 1, 6, 12, 18, 24, 30, and 36 (remove markers as you come to them while working Border Round), dc in end of each unmarked row and skip each marked row.

### FINISHING

Weave in ends.

### Abbreviations

ch = chain; cm = centimeters; dc = double crochet; mm = millimeters; st(s) = stitch(es); \* or \*\* = repeat whatever follows the \* or \*\* as indicated.
