

## What you will need:

**RED HEART° Super Saver°** Jumbo: 2 skeins 971 Camouflage A and 1 skein of 312 Black B or **RED HEART**° Super Saver°: 4 skeins 971 Camouflage A and 1 skein 312 Black B

Susan Bates<sup>®</sup> Crochet Hook: 5.5mm [US I-9]

Yarn needle

**GAUGE:** 14 dc = 4" [10 cm]; 8 rows dc = 5" [13 cm]. CHECK YOUR GAUGE. Use any size hook to obtain the gauge.



# **Man Cave Throw**

For guys of any age that are into the outdoors, choose this crochet camouflage throw. It's an easy, no nonsense design that will suit his rustic sense of style.

Throw measures 41" x 50" (104 cm x 127 cm)

#### Notes

- 1. The chain-2 at the beginning of each row of the Blanket does not count as a separate stitch.
- 2. The chain-3 at the beginning of each round of the Border counts as a double crochet.
- 3. Either side can be the Right Side.

# BLANKET

With **A**. ch 127.

**Row 1:** Dc in 3rd ch from hook (skipped chs are not counted as a st), dc in next 4 ch, \*ch 1, skip 1 ch, [dc, ch 1, skip 1 ch] twice, dc in next 5 ch; repeat from \* across; turn—125 dc.

Rows 2-70: Ch 2 (not counted as a st), dc in first 5 dc, \*ch 1, skip 1 ch, [dc, ch 1, skip 1 ch] twice, dc in next 5 dc; repeat from \* across: turn—125 sts. Fasten off A at end of last row. Do not turn.

# BORDER

Rotate Blanket to work across ends of rows. Border is worked in rounds.

Round 1: Join B in side of last st made. Ch 4 (counts as dc, ch 1), (dc, ch 1) into side of next row and each row across; working across opposite side of foundation ch, (dc, ch 3, dc) in first ch, ch 1, skip 1 ch, \*dc, ch 1, skip 1 ch; repeat from \* across to last ch, (dc, ch 3, dc) in last ch; working in ends of rows of other side, ch 1, (dc, ch 1) into side of each row across; working across top edge, (dc, ch 3, dc) in first dc, ch 1, skip 1 dc,\*dc, ch 1, skip 1 dc; repeat from \* across to last dc, (dc, ch 3, dc) in last dc; ch 1, slip st in top of ch-3 to join.

Round 2: Slip st into first ch-1 space, ch 3 (counts as dc), dc into same space (beginning shell made), \*2 dc into next ch-1 space (shell made) and into each ch-1 space across to corner, (2 dc, ch 3, 2 dc) into ch-3 space; repeat from \* 3 times; 2 dc into last ch-1 space, slip st in top of ch-3 to join. Round 3: Slip st in top of next dc and between shells, ch 4 (counts as dc, ch 1), \*dc between next 2 shells, ch 1; repeat from \* across to corner, (dc, ch 4, dc) into ch-3 space, ch 1; repeat from \* 3 times; [dc between next 2 shells, ch 1] twice, slip st in top of ch-3 to join.

Round 4: Slip st into first ch-1 space, ch 3 (counts as dc), dc into same space; \*2 dc into next ch-1 space and each ch-1 space across to corner, (2 dc, ch 3, 2 dc) into ch-4 space; repeat from \* 3 times; [2 dc into next ch-1 space] 3 times, slip st in top of ch-3 to join. Fasten off B; weave in loose ends.

### ABBREVIATIONS

**A**, **B** = Color A, Color B; **ch** = chain; **cm** = centimeters: **dc** = double crochet: **mm** = millimeters; **sc** = single crochet; **st(s)** = stitch(es); () = work all directions in parentheses in the indicated stitch or space; [] = work directions in brackets the number of times specified; \* or \*\* = repeat whatever follows the \* or \*\* as indicated.
