What you will need:

RED HEART® Super Saver®:
1 skein 390 Hot Red A, small
amount 312 Black B.

Susan Bates® Knitting Needles:
5mm [US 8].

Susan Bates® Crochet Hook:
5mm [US H-8].

Yarn needle, stitch holder, stitch
marker.

GAUGE: 17 sts = 4"; 23 rows =
4" in St st. CHECK YOUR GAUGE.
Use any size needles to obtain
the gauge.

Strawberry Mittens

*Almost yummy enough to eat, these
strawberry mittens will keep her hands warm
when the cold winds blow. The seeds are
added with easy-to-embroider French knots,
and the ties will help keep the mittens snug.*

Directions are for child's size 2; changes for
sizes 4 and 6 are in parentheses.

Finished hand length: 4½ (5½, 6)" [11 (14,
15) cm].

Special Abbreviation

M1 (Make 1 stitch) = Pick up the loop
between sts and place it on the left hand
needle; knit into the back of picked-up loop.

MITTENS (Make 2)

Cuff

With A, cast on 24 (26, 28) sts. Work 3" in K1,
P1 ribbing.

Eyelet Rows

Row 1 (Wrong Side): Knit.

Row 2: K1, * yo, K2tog; repeat from * to last st,
K1 – 24 (26, 28) sts.

Row 3: Knit.

Hand

Beginning with a Knit row, work 4 rows in St st.

Thumb Gusset

Row 1: K12 (13, 14), M1, K12 (13, 14) – 25
(27, 29) sts.

Row 2 and all Wrong Side rows: Purl.

Row 3: K12 (13, 14), M1, K1, M1, K12 (13, 14)
– 27 (29, 31) sts.

Row 5: K12 (13, 14), M1, K3, M1, K12 (13, 14)
– 29 (31, 33) sts.

Row 7: K12 (13, 14), M1, K5, M1, K12 (13, 14)
– 31 (33, 35) sts.

Sizes 4 and 6 Only-Row 9: K (13, 14), M1, K7,
M1, K (13, 14) – 35 (37) sts

All Sizes Next Wrong Side Row: P12 (13, 14),
place next 7 (9, 9) sts on a stitch holder, place
stitch marker, P12 (13, 14) – 24 (26, 28) sts.
Work in St st until mitten measures 6½ (7¼,
7¾)" [16 (18, 20) cm] from cast-on edge,
ending with a Purl row.

Shaping Row 1: * K1, slip 1, K1, pssso, knit
to 3 sts before marker, K2tog, K2, slip 1, K1,
pssso, knit to 3 sts before end, K2tog, K1 – 20
(22, 24) sts.

Shaping Row 2: Purl.

Repeat Shaping Rows 1 and 2 twice more,
end Purl row – 12 (14, 16) sts. Bind off loosely.

Thumb

With right side facing and A, pick up one st
before holder, knit across 7 (9, 9) sts from
holder, pick up one st after holder – 9 (11,
11) sts.

Beginning with a K row, work 6 (6, 7) rows in
St st; cut yarn, leaving a 12" (30 cm) tail. Run
tail through sts on needle, remove needle and
pull tail tight to close top of thumb. Use same
yarn to sew thumb seam.

Ties (Make 2)

With crochet hook and A, ch 80. Fasten off.

Assembly

Embroider French Knots on back of each hand
with B. Weave in all loose ends and sew side
seams. Weave a Tie through each Eyelet Row
above Cuffs.

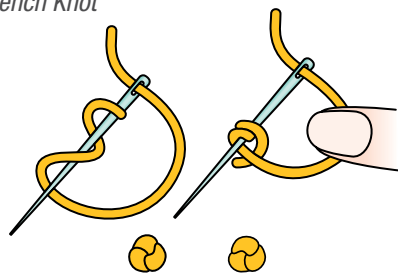

Abbreviations: A, B = color A, B; ch = chain; K = knit; mm = millimeters; P = purl; pssso = pass the slipped st over; St st = Stockinette stitch (Knit on right side rows; Purl on wrong side rows.); st(s) = stitch (es); tog = together; yo = yarn over; * = repeat whatever follows the * as indicated.



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
