# Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

#### From Fabric A, cut:

two 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: thirty 2-1/2" squares for the Star Block Centers six 1-7/8" x WOF strips. Subcut: one hundred twenty 1-7/8" square for the Flying Geese

#### From Fabric B, cut:

ten 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: thirty 1-1/2" x 6-1/2" strips for Piece 4 thirty 1-1/2" x 5-1/2" strips for Piece 3

### From Fabric C, cut:

three 3-1/4" x WOF strips. Subcut: thirty 3-1/4" squares for the Flying Geese seventeen 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: thirty 1-1/2" x 5-1/2" strips for Piece 2 thirty 1-1/2" x 4-1/2" strips for Piece 1 one hundred twenty 1-1/2" squares

#### From Fabric D, cut:

eleven 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: thirty 1-1/2" x 7-1/2" strips for Piece 6 thirty 1-1/2" x 6-1/2" strips for Piece 5

#### From Fabric E, cut:

fourteen 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: thirty 1-1/2" x 8-1/2" strips for Piece 8 thirty 1-1/2" x 7-1/2" strips for Piece 7

#### From Fabric F, cut:

fifteen 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: thirty 1-1/2" x 9-1/2" strips for Piece 10 thirty 1-1/2" x 8-1/2" strips for Piece 9

### From Fabric G, cut:

fifteen 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: thirty 1-1/2" x 10-1/2" strips for Piece 12 thirty 1-1/2" x 9-1/2" strips for Piece 11

### From Fabric H, cut:

eighteen 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: thirty 1-1/2" x 11-1/2" strips for Piece 14 thirty 1-1/2" x 10-1/2" strips for Piece 13 From Fabric I, cut: twenty 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: thirty 1-1/2" x 12-1/2" strips for Piece 16 thirty 1-1/2" x 11-1/2" strips for Piece 15

From the Binding Fabric, cut:

seven 2-1/2" x WOF strips

# Assemble the Star Block Centers

**Step 1:** Pin two 1-7/8" Fabric A squares in opposing corners of a 3-1/4" Fabric C square, RST. The squares will overlap slightly in the center of the large square. Using a ruler, draw a diagonal line through the squares.

**Step 2:** Sew scant 1/4" seam on each side of the diagonal line. Set the seam by pressing it flat. Cut along the diagonal line, creating two identical units.

Step 3: Press the fabric toward smaller triangles. Repeat with the second unit.

**Step 4:** Place one 1-7/8" Fabric A square at the corner of sewn block unit. Draw diagonal line in pencil. Sew a scant 1/4" seam on each side of diagonal line. Set seam (press). Cut along diagonal line, creating two identical units.

**Step 5:** Press the seam toward the smaller triangle. Trim off the small dog ears left by the seam allowance. Trim to 1-1/2" x 2-1/2" if necessary. Repeat to make four flying geese blocks.

**Step 6:** Repeat with all remaining 1-7/8" Fabric A squares and 3-1/4" Fabric C squares to make a total of one hundred twenty flying geese blocks.

Assemble the Blocks

**Step 7:** Gather: one Star Block Unit one of each of Piece 2-16

Arrange the block pieces as shown. Start at the center of the block and sew pieces together to form the log cabin block, working toward the outermost pieces and sewing in numerical order. Press the seams open or away from the center.









The block will measure 12-1/2" square.

Step 8: Repeat Step 7 to make a total of thirty blocks.



Assemble the Quilt

**Step 9:** Arrange the blocks into six rows of five blocks. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Quilt Assembly Diagram.

**Step 10:** Sew the blocks together to form rows. Press the rows to the left in the odd numbered rows and to the right in the even numbered rows.

Step 11: Sew the rows together to form the quilt center. Press the row seams open.

Your quilt top is complete! Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!

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
