More Yarn Information

NEEDLES

1 pair 3mm (no 11) (US 2/3) needles

BUTTONS

2 x buttons (10mm).

TENSION

28 sts and 36 rows to 10 cm measured over st st using 3mm (US 2/3) needles.

BACK and FRONT (both alike)

Using 3mm (US 2/3) needles and yarn A cast on 67 [71: 73: 75: 79: 81] sts. Work in g st for 6 rows, ending with RS facing for next row. **Row 7 (RS):** Knit. **Row 8:** K5 [5: 5: 6: 6: 6], P to last 5 [5: 5: 6: 6: 6] sts, K5 [5: 5: 6: 6: 6]. Rep last 2 rows 5 [5: 6: 6: 7: 7] times more. **Sizes 9-12 and 12-18 months and 2 years only Next row (RS):** Knit. **Next row:** K5, P to last 5 sts, K5.

All sizes

Next row (RS): Knit. Next row: K4, P to last 4 sts, K4. Next row: Knit. Next row: K3, P to last 3 sts, K3. Next row: Knit. Next row: K2, P to last 2 sts, K2. Next row: Knit. Next row: K1, P to last st, K1. Place markers at both ends of last row (to denote top of side seam openings). Beg with a K row, work in st st for 20 [26: 28: 32: 36: 40] rows, ending with RS facing for next row. (Work should meas approx 12 [13.5: 15: 16.5: 18: 19.5] cm.) Shape armholes Place markers at both ends of last row (to denote base of armhole openings). Next row (RS): K3, sl 1, K1, psso, K to last 5 sts, K2tog, K3. Next row: K3, P to last 3 sts, K3. Rep last 2 rows 7 times more. 51 [55: 57: 59: 63: 65] sts. Next row (RS): Knit. Next row: K3, P to last 3 sts, K3. Last 2 rows set the sts for rest of work - first and last 3 sts in g st with all other sts in st st. Keeping sts correct, work 10 [12: 12: 14: 16: 18] rows, ending with RS facing for next row. Shape neck Row 1 (RS): K16 [17:18:17:19:20], wrap next st (by slipping next st from left needle onto right needle, taking yarn to opposite side of work between needles and then slipping same st back onto left needle - when working back across wrapped sts work the wrapped st and the wrapping loop tog as one st) and turn. Row 2: Patt to end. Row 3: K13 [14: 15: 14: 16: 17], wrap next st and turn. Row 4: Patt to end. **Row 5:** K11 [12: 13: 12: 14: 15], wrap next st and turn. Row 6: Patt to end. Row 7: K10 [11: 12: 11: 13: 14], wrap next st and turn. Row 8: Patt to end. Row 9: K to end. Row 10: Patt 16 [17: 18: 17: 19: 20] sts, wrap next st and turn. Row 11: K to end. Row 12: Patt 13 [14: 15: 14: 16: 17] sts, wrap next st and turn. Row 13: K to end.

Row 14: Patt 11 [12: 13: 12: 14: 15] sts, wrap next st and turn. **Row 15**: K to end.

R O WA N

Row 16: Patt 10 [11: 12: 11: 13: 14] sts, wrap next st and turn. **Row 17**: K to end.

These 17 rows complete neck shaping.

For back only

Work in g st across all sts for 6 rows, ending with **WS** facing for next row.

For front only

Work in g st across all sts for 3 rows, ending with RS facing for next row.

Next row (RS): K7 [8: 9: 8: 10: 11], yfwd, K2tog (to make first buttonhole), K to last 9 [10: 11: 10: 12: 13] sts, sl 1, K1, psso, yfwd (to make 2nd buttonhole), K7 [8: 9: 8: 10: 11].

Work in g st for a further 2 rows, ending with **WS** facing for next row.

For back and front

Cast off knitwise (on **WS**).


SLEEVES

Using 3mm (US 2/3) needles and yarn A cast on 33 [37: 37: 39: 39: 43] sts.

Work in g st for 6 rows, ending with RS facing for next row.

Beg with a K row, cont in st st throughout as folls:

Inc 1 st at each end of next [3rd: 3rd: 3rd: 3rd: 3rd] and every foll alt [4th: 4th: 4th: 6th] row to 39 [47: 53: 49: 49: 65] sts, then on every foll 4th [6th: 6th: 6th: 6th: -] row until there are 51 [53: 57: 59: 61: -] sts.



Cont straight until sleeve meas 12 [14: 16: 18: 20: 22.5] cm, ending with RS facing for next row.

Shape top

Place markers at both ends of last row (to denote top of sleeve seam).

Next row (RS): K1, sl 1, K1, psso, K to last 3 sts, K2tog, K1. **Next row:** Purl.

Rep last 2 rows 5 times more. 39 [41: 45: 47: 49: 53] sts. **Next row (RS):** K1, sl 1, K1, psso, K to last 3 sts, K2tog, K1. **Next row:** P1, P2tog, P to last 3 sts, P2tog tbl, P1. Cast off rem 35 [37: 41: 43: 45: 49] sts.

MAKING UP

Press as described on the ball band.

Embroidery

Following chart and using photograph as a guide, swiss darn crosses across lower edge of back, front and both sleeves, placing first band of crosses 1 row above g st borders. Across body sections, leave side opening g st borders free and embroider complete crosses **only**.

Lay front over back so that the g st shoulder sections overlap and sew together at armhole edges.

Set in sleeves using the shallow set-in method and leaving side seams open below markers.
