

### GENERAL INFO

# TENSION

It is essential to work to the stated tension in order to achieve the desired fabric and garment size, you should always start by knitting a tension square before knitting the full garment.

If you have fewer stitches than stated you will need to go down needle sizes until the correct tension is achieved and if you have more you will need to go up needle sizes. Please check individual patterns for tension before starting the garment.

# WORKING FROM A CHART

When working from a chart you will read all right side rows from right to left and wrong side rows from left to right.

### FINISHING

We recommend using mattress stitch for seaming your garment. When sewing in a raglan sleeve you will match row for row. When sewing in a semi set in sleeve you need to pin the sleeve in position matching the centre of the sleeve cast off to the shoulder of the body, you will then ease the sleeve into the armhole.

Once your garment is completed it is essential to block your knitting. Pin your garment out to the size stated in the pattern. Cover with damp cloths and leave until dry.

# FAIRISLE HAT & MITTENS

# **MEASUREMENTS**

# Mittens

width (around palm) 19cm

Hat

To fit average size ladies head

# MATERIALS

#### YARN

(To make hat and mittens)

West Yorkshire Spinners - Illustrious DK

A Royal (174) 1 x 100g balls
B Claret (508) 1 x 100g balls
C Fern (344) 1 x 100g balls
D Dusky Lilac (704) 1 x 100g balls

#### **NEEDLES**

1 Set of four 4mm double pointed needles (DPNs) or 4mm (US 6 /UK 8) long circular needles (using magic loop method)

Please note: Both hat and mittens can be completed using magic loop

Cable needle

65mm Pompom maker (optional) for hat

Stitch marker

Stitch holder for mittens

# TENSION

22 sts and 28 rows to 10cm measured over stocking stitch on 4mm needles or size needed to achieve stated tension. It is very important to follow the blocking instructions given below.

PLEASE CHECK YOUR TENSION AS IT IS ESSENTIAL TO ACHIEVE THIS TENSION IN ORDER TO ACHIEVE SUCCESS.

# SPECIAL ABBREVIATIONS

C6B - Slip next 3 sts onto cable needle and hold at back of work, k3 then k3 from cable needle.

M1 - Make one stitch. Pick up loop between last and next stitch and work into back of this loop.

# SPECIAL NOTES

#### **WORKING FROM A CHART**

When working from a chart you will read all right side rounds from right to left.

#### FAIR ISLE

When working in more than 1 colour, the colour not in use should be stranded loosely across back of work and woven in where necessary to retain elasticity of fabric.





# HAT

Using 4mm circular or double pointed needles and A, cast on 112 sts.

**Rnd 1:** \* K2, p2, rep from \* to end.

This rnd sets rib.

Cont in rib until work measures 5cm.

Next rnd: K7, (m1, k14) 7 times, m1, k7. 120 sts.

Break off A, join in B and D.

#### SEE CHART A

Rnd 1: \* K1B, k2D, k5B, k2D, k1B, k1D, rep from \* to end. Cont as set until all 21 rnds of chart A have been worked. Break off B, using C only work the next 3 rnds as follows:-

Next rnd: Knit.

Next rnd: K6, (k2tog, k13) 7 times, k2tog, k7. 112 sts.

**Next rnd:** Knit. Break off C.

Next rnd: Using A, knit.

**Next rnd:** Using A, k6, (k2tog, k12) 7 times, k2tog, k6.

104 sts

Break off A and using B throughout proceed as follows:-

Next rnd: Knit.

Next rnd: \* K6, p7, rep from \* to end.

Rep last rnd once more.

**Next rnd:** \* C6B, p7, rep from \* to end. **Next rnd:** \* K6, p7, rep from \* to end.

Rep last rnd twice more.

The last 4 rnds set cable patt.

Work 4 more rnds of cable patt.

#### **Shape Crown**

Next rnd: \* C6B, p2tog, p3, p2tog, rep from \* to end. 88 sts.

Next rnd: \* K6, p5, rep from \* to end.

Rep last rnd twice more.

Next rnd: \* C6B, p2tog, p1, p2tog, rep from \* to end.

72 sts.

Next rnd: \* K6, p3, rep from \* to end.

Rep last rnd three times more.

Next rnd: \* Sl1, k2tog, psso, rep from \* to end. 24 sts.

Break off yarn and thread through rem 24 sts.

Pull up tight, and fasten off securely.

# MAKING UP

Using A or left over yarn make a pompom and attach to centre of hat.

#### BLOCKING

Pin hat out and cover with damp cloths and leave to dry.



# MITTENS (BOTH ALIKE)

Using 4mm double pointed needles and A, cast on 40 sts. Join to work in the round be careful not to twist the sts. Place marker at beg of round.

**Rnd 1:** \* K2, p2, rep from \* to end.

This rnd sets rib.

Work 11 more rnds of rib.

Next rnd: Knit.

Join in D and knit 2 rnds.

Break off D and using A proceed as follows:-

Knit 2 rnds.

Next rnd: (K1, m1) twice k to end. 42 sts.

Next rnd: Knit.

**Next rnd:** K1, m1, k3, m1, k to end. 44 sts.

Next rnd: Knit.

**Next rnd:** K1, m1, k5, m1, k to end. 46 sts.

Next rnd: Knit.

**Next rnd:** K1, m1, k7, m1, k to end. 48 sts.

Next rnd: Knit.

**Next rnd:** K1, m1, k9, m1, k to end. 50 sts.

Next rnd: Knit.

**Next rnd:** K1, m1, k11, m1, k to end. 52 sts.

Next rnd: Knit.

**Next rnd:** K1, m1, k13, m1, k to end. 54 sts.

Next rnd: Knit.

Rep last rnd only (working straight) a further 8 times more.

8 times more.
Slip first 15 sts onto a stitch holder for thumb and

keeping working in rnds over rem 39 sts placing marker at beg of rnd.

Knit 7 rnds.

**Next rnd:** (K10, m1) 3 times, k9. 42 sts.

Join in B and C.

#### SEE CHART B

Rnd 1: \* K1B, k2C, rep from \* to end.

Cont as set until all 5 rnds of chart B have been worked.

Break off B and C.

Using A, knit 2 rnds.

Break off A, join in D.

Using D only, proceed as follows:-

Knit 4 rnds.

**Next rnd:** K18, k2tog, k2, sl1, k1, psso, k to end. 40 sts.

Next rnd: Knit.

**Next rnd:** K17, k2tog, k2, sl1, k1, psso, k to end. 38 sts.

Next rnd: Knit.

**Next rnd:** (K1, sl1, k1, psso, k13, k2tog, k1) twice. 34 sts.

Next rnd: Knit.

**Next rnd:** (K1, sl1, k1, psso, k11, k2tog, k1) twice. 30 sts.

Next rnd: Knit.

Next rnd: (K1 sl1, k1, psso) twice, k3, (k2tog, k1) twice,

rep from \* to end. 22 sts.

Divide sts over 2 needles (11 sts per needle) and join

using Kitchener stitch as follows:-

Have both sets of stitches you want to join on two needles with WS of work facing. Thread a needle with yarn 3 times the width of seam.

### Set Up

Thread yarn needle through first st on the front needle as if to purl, pull yarn through, leave st on needle. Thread yarn needle through the first stitch on the back needle as if to knit. Leave stitch on needle.

Thread yarn through first st on front needle as if to knit slip st off needle.

Thread yarn through next st on front needle as if to purl leave on needle.

Thread yarn through first st on back needle as if to purl, slip st off needle.

Thread yarn through next st on back needle as if to knit, leave on needle.

Rep these 4 steps.

Say "Front knit off, front purl on, back purl off, back knit on."

#### **Thumb**

Rejoin A to 15 sts left on a holder for thumb and join into rnd. Place marker at beg of round.


Knit 13 rnds (or length desired for thumb).

Break off yarn and thread through 15 sts. Pull up tight, and fasten off securely.


### MAKING UP

Pin mittens out and cover with damp cloths and leave to dry.




### KEY
