

Special Abbreviations C6B slip next 3 sts onto cn and hold at back, k3 from

Set in sleeve (armhole)

Reverse Stocking Stitch (back and sleeves)

C6F slip next 3 sts onto cn and hold at front, k3 from left hand needle, k3 from cn

Pewter 838 x 4(4:5:5:6:6:7:8) hanks

#### **NEEDLES**


4mm (US 6) knitting needles

#### **EXTRAS**

2 x Stitch Holders Cable needle


Tension

21sts x 30 rows to 10cm/4in over reverse stocking stitch using 4mm (US 6) needles





# Mixed Cable Jumper Panel



Pattern Notes

Rev St St

Row 1 (RS): Purl.

Row 2 (WS): Knit.

### Pattern

#### **CABLE PANEL**

Row 1 (RS): K9, p4, k3, p4, k12, p4, k3, p4, k9.

Row 2 (WS): P9, k4, p3, k4, p12, k4, p3, k4, p9.

Row 3: C6B, k3, p4, k3, p4, C6B, C6F, p4, k3, p4, C6B, k3.

Row 4: As Row 2.

Row 5: As Row 1.

Row 6: As Row 2.

Row 7: K3, C6F, p4, k3, p4, k12, p4, k3, p4, k3, C6F.

Row 8: As Row 2.

These 8 rows form patt and are repeated.

#### FRONT

Using 4mm (US 6) needles, cast on

90(96:100:106:112:116:122:128)sts.

Work in rib as folls:

1st, 4th and 7th sizes only

Row 1 (RS): (K2, p2) to last 2 sts, k2.

Row 2: (P2, k2) to last 2 sts p2.

Rep these 2 rows twice more

2nd, 3rd, 5th, 6th and 8th sizes only

Row 1 (RS): (K2, p2) to end.

Rep this row five times more. \*\*

#### All sizes

Work rib row 1 again ending with WS facing for next row

Inc row (WS): P32(35:37:40:43:45:48:51)sts,

(m1, p2) 14 times, P30(33:35:38:41:43:46:49)sts.

104(110:114:120:126:130:136:142)sts

Now work Cable and Rev St St Patt as folls:

Row 1 (RS): P26(29:31:34:37:39:42:45), work Row 1 of Cable

Panel, P26(29:31:34:37:39:42:45).

**Row 2:** K26(**29**:31:**34**:37:**39**:42:**45**), work Row 2 of Cable Panel, K26(**29**:31:**34**:37:**39**:42:**45**).

These 2 rows set Cable Panel and Rev St St Patt.
Cont as set, working appropriate row of Cable Panel until work measures 36(38:39:40:42:44:46:48)cm,
14.25(15:15.5:15.75:16.5:17.25:18.25:19)in from cast-on

edge and ending with a **WS** row.

#### Shape armhole

Keeping Cable Panel correct work armhole shaping as folls: Cast off 7(7:7:8:8:9:10:10) sts at beg of next 2 rows.

90(96:100:104:110:112:116:122)sts

Cast off 4 sts at beg of next 2 rows.

82(88:92:96:102:104:108:114)sts

Cast off 2 sts at beg of next 2 rows.

78(84:88:92:98:100:104:110)sts

Cont straight in patt without shaping until armhole measures 13(13:14:14:15:15:16:17)cm,

5.25(**5.25**:5.5:**5.5**:6:6:6.25:**6.75**)in from beg of armhole shaping ending on a **WS** row.

#### Shape left neck and shoulders

Patt 27(30:32:34:37:37:39:41)sts, turn, working on these sts only for left neck, leave rem 51(54:56:58:61:63:65:69)sts on a holder.

Next row (WS): Cast off 8 sts, patt to end.

19(22:24:26:29:29:31:33)sts

Next and every foll RS row: Patt to end.

Next row (WS): Cast off 4 sts, patt to end.

15(18:20:22:25:25:27:29)sts

Next row (WS): Cast off 2 sts, patt to end.

13(16:18:20:23:23:25:27)sts

Next row (WS): Dec 1 st at neck edge, patt to end.

12(**15**:17:**19**:22:**22**:24:**26**)sts

Cont in patt until armhole measures

18(18:19:19:20:20:21:22)cm, 7(7:7.5:7.5:8:8:8.25:8.75)in ending with a RS row.

Cast off knit-wise on **WS**.

With RS facing slip centre 24(24:24:24:24:26:26:26)sts onto a holder, rejoin yarn to rem 27(30:32:34:37:37:39:41)sts

Next row (RS): Cast off 8 sts, patt to end.

19(22:24:26:29:29:31:33)sts

Next and every foll WS row: Patt to end.

Next row (RS): Cast off 4 sts, patt to end.

15(18:20:22:25:25:27:29)sts

Next row (RS): Cast off 2 sts, patt to end.

13(16:18:20:23:23:25:27)sts

Next row (RS): Dec 1 st at neck edge, patt to end.

12(15:17:19:22:22:24:26)sts

Cont in patt until armhole measures

18(18:19:19:20:20:21:22)cm, 7(7:7.5:7.5:8:8:8.25:8.75)in ending with WS facing for the next row.

Cast off knit-wise on WS.

#### **BACK**

Work as for Front to \*\*.

Beg with RS facing work in Rev St St until work measures 36(38:39:40:42:44:46:48)cm, 14.25(15:15.5:15.75:16.5:17.25:18. 25:19)in from cast-on edge and ending with a WS row.

#### Shape armhole

Cast off 7(7:7:8:8:9:10:10) sts at beg of next 2 rows.

76(82:86:90:96:98:102:108)sts

Cast off 4 sts at beg of next 2 rows. 68(74:78:82:88:90:94:100)sts Cast off 2 sts at beg of next 2 rows. 64(70:74:78:84:86:90:96)sts Cont straight in patt without shaping until armhole measures 18(18:19:19:20:20:21:22)cm, 7(7:7.5:7.5:8:8:8.25:8.75)in ending with a RS row. Cast off 12(15:17:19:22:22:24:26)sts at beg of the next 2 rows.

Leave rem 40(40:40:40:40:42:42:44)sts on a holder.

#### SLEEVES (both alike)

Using 4mm (US 6) needles, cast on 40(40:40:42:42:46:50:50)sts. Work in rib as folls:

1st, 2nd and 3rd only

Row 1 (RS): (K2, p2) to end.

Repeat this row 5 times more.

4th, 5th, 6th, 7th, and 8th Sizes only

Row 1 (RS): (K2, p2) to last 2 sts, k2.

Row 2: (P2, k2) to last 2 sts, p2.

Rep these 2 rows twice more.

#### All Sizes

Beg with a purl row cont in Rev St St throughout, inc 1 st at each end of next and 13(13:14:14:14:15:16) foll 8th rows. 68(68:70:72:72:76:82:84)sts

43(43:45.5:45.5:48.5:51:51:52)cm, (17[17:18:18:19:20:20:20.5]in) ending with a WS row.

#### Shape armhole and sleeve head

Cast off 7(7:7:8:8:9:10:10) sts at beg of next 2 rows.

54(54:56:56:56:58:62:64)sts

Cast off 4 sts at beg of next 2 rows. 46(46:48:48:48:50:54:56)sts Cast off 2 sts at beg of next 2 rows. 42(42:44:44:44:46:50:52)sts Work 2 rows.

Dec 1 st at each end of next row. 40(40:42:42:42:44:48:50)sts Work 3 rows

Rep last 4 rows once more. 38(38:40:40:40:42:46:48)sts Dec 1 st at each end of next row and foll alt row.

34(34:36:36:36:38:42:44)sts

Work 3 rows ending with RS facing for next row. Dec 1 st at each end of next row and 3 foll alt rows. 26(26:28:28:28:30:34:36)sts

Cast off 3 sts at beg of next 2 rows. 20(20:22:22:22:24:28:30)sts Cast off 2 sts at beg of next 2 rows. 16(16:18:18:18:20:24:26)sts Cast off 3 sts at beg of next 2 rows. 10(10:12:12:12:14:18:20)sts

Work 1 row, decreasing 1 st at each end of row.

8(8:10:10:10:12:16:18)sts

Cast off knit-wise with WS facing.

#### MAKING UP

#### **NECKBAND**

Sew left shoulder seam.

Using 4mm (US 6) needles, re-join yarn,

k40(40:40:40:40:42:42:44)sts left on holder for back neck, pick up and knit 12(12:14:14:16:16:18:18)sts evenly down left front neck, k24(24:24:24:24:26:26:28)sts from Front neck holder, and 12(12:14:14:16:16:18:18)sts evenly up right front neck. 88(88:92:92:96:100:104:108)sts.

Now work rib as folls:

Row 1 (WS): (K2, p2) to end.

Rep this row 3 times more.

Cast off in rib.

Block garment pieces using preferred method.

Sew right shoulder.

Join centre of sleeve head cast offs to shoulder seam and neatly ease in sleeve head into armholes

Sew side and sleeve seams using mattress stitch.

Fasten off any loose ends.






# Illustrious Pattern Book by Emma Wright

When designing the Illustrious pattern book, we wanted to show the process of developing a new yarn collection from the initial concept right through to the finished product. We worked with the talented Emma Wright to produce a stunning collection of 11 patterns with simple silhouettes and interesting texture stitches that do the yarn justice.

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Over the years we have blended and mixed many types of raw materials together. The aim is to combine compatible qualities that not only look and feel fantastic (with softness of touch and clear stitch definition) but will also perform well as a garment through consistent wash and wear.

We wanted the colours in this range to be as inspiring and as luxurious as the yarn and so we invested our time ensuring that the mix of colours and shades not only worked well individually but also complemented each other. Finally we used our technology to create some exciting variegated combinations which we feel completes this stunning collection.
