Instructions given for smallest size, larger sizes given in brackets. Where only one figure is given this applies to all sizes. Please note that the limitations of the printing process mean the actual colour will not always precisely match the colours in the photograph.

IMPORTANT

Use only the Yarnsmiths yarn specified. We cannot accept responsibility for an imperfect garment if any other brand is used. It is essential to work to the tension stated. The quantities of yarn stated are based on average requirements and are therefore approximate.

ABBREVIATIONS

K - Knit; **P** - Purl; **st(s)** - stitch(es); **st st** - stocking stitch (1 row K, 1 row P); **g st** - garter stitch (every row K); **inc** - increase; **dec** - decrease; **rept** - repeat; **alt** - alternate; **beg** - beginning; **tog** - together; **sl** - slip; **sl 1** - slip one stitch; **sl 2tog K** - slip 2 together knitwise;

pssso - pass slipped stitch over; **p2sso** - pass two slipped stitches over; **yfwd**-yarn forward; **rs** - right side; **MI** - make one stitch. Pick up loop before next st and Knit through back of loop; **0** - No stitches or times or rows to be worked in that particular size; **patt** - pattern; **cm** - centimetres; **ins** - inches; **M** - main shade; **C** - contrast colour.

Wrap and Turn

Knit to the point where you will wrap and turn. Bring the yarn to the front between the needles. Slip the next stitch on the left needle to the right needle, purlwise. Bring the yarn to the back between the needles. Slip the stitch from the right needle back to the left. Turn. The yarn is now correctly positioned to continue.

TENSION

It is important to check your tension before commencing the garment. 24sts and 32 rows to 10cm, 4ins over st st on 4mm needles. If there are too many stitches to 10cm, then your tension is tight and you will need to change your needle to a larger size. If there are too few stitches to 10cm, then your tension is loose and you will need to change your needle to a smaller size.

GIRL'S DUNGAREES

Legs (Make 4)

Using 3.25 mm needles and M, cast on 63 (69, 75)sts.

1st row (rs) - K3, * P3, K3, rept from * to end.

2nd row - P3, * K3, P3, rept from * to end.

Rept 1st and 2nd rows once more.

Next row (dec row) - * sl 2tog K, K1, p2sso, P3tog, rept from * to last 3 sts sl 2tog K, K1, p2sso. 21 (23, 25) sts.

★ **Next row** - P1, * K1, P1, rept from * to end.

Next row - K1, * P1, K1, rept from * to end.

Rept last 2 rows twice more.

Next row (Inc row) - Rib 1 (2, 3)

* M1, rib 1, M1, rib 2, rept from * to last 2 (3, 4) sts, M1, rib to end. 34 (36, 38) sts.

Change to 4mm needles and work in st st until Leg measures 21 (21, 24) cm, (8.25, 8.25, 9.5)ins from end of rib ending with a P row.

Leave sts on a Holder.

BACK

★★ Using 4mm needles and M, cast on 7 (7,9)sts.

Break yarn, leave sts on a Holder.

Using 4mm needles and M, K across 34 (36,38)sts of one Leg, K across 7 (7, 9) sts from Holder, K across 34 (36, 38) sts of a second Leg. 75 (79, 85) sts.

Continue in st st, work 3 (3, 5) rows ending with a P row.

Dec 1 st at each end of next and every following 4th row. 67 (71, 75) sts.

Work straight until Back measures 6 (8, 9)cm, 2.5 (3, 3.5)ins ending with a P row.

Cast off 3 sts at beg of next 2 rows.

Work straight until Back measures 15 (16, 17)cm, 6 (6.5, 6.5)ins ending with a P row. ★★

Shape Back

1st and 2nd rows - Work to last 28 sts, wrap and turn.

3rd and 4th rows - Work to last 21 sts, wrap and turn.

5th and 6th rows - Work to last 14 sts, wrap and turn.

7th and 8th rows - Work to last 7 sts, wrap and turn.

9th row - K to end.

10th row - P across all sts.

Next row - K1, * P1, K1, rept from * to end.

Next row - P1, * K1, P1, rept from * to end.

Rept last 2 rows until rib measures 2 cm, 1 ins.

Cast off in rib.

FRONT

Work as given for Back from

★★ to ★★.

Shape Bib

Cast off 3 sts at beg of next 6 rows. Dec 1 st at each end of next 5 rows. Work 1 row. Dec 1 st at each end of next and every alt row until, 29 (33, 37) sts, remain.

Work 1 (3, 3) rows ending with a P row.

Place a marker on centre st.

Next row - K1, * P1, K1, rept from * to end.

Next row - P1, * K1, P1, rept from * to end.

Rept last 2 rows 3 times more, cast off evenly in rib.

MAKING UP

Join leg and side seams by top sewing leaving 9cm, 3.5ins open down each side seam for openings. Join rib by top stitching. Swiss darn Motif on Bib as shown on charts.

STRAPS (make 2)

★★★ Using 3.25mm needles and M, cast on 9 sts.

1st row - K2 (P1, K1) 3 times, K1.

2nd row - K1, * P1, K1, rept from * to end. ★★★

Rept 1st and 2nd rows until strap **when slightly stretched** fits along side edge of Bib.

Sew in position by top sewing. Continue in rib until strap measures 26 (27, 28)cm, 10 (10.5 11)ins or 2 cm, 1 inch less than required length, ending with a 2nd row.

Next row (Buttonhole row) - K2, P1, K2tog, yfwd, rib to end. Continue in rib for 27 (28, 29) cm, 10.5 (11, 11.5) ins or required length. Cast off in rib.

Button Band (Make 2)

Work as given for straps from ★★★ to ★★★.

Rept 1st and 2nd rows until band **when slightly stretched** fits up side opening to top of cast off edge of back of dungarees. Cast off in rib. Sew in position by top sewing.

Mark positions for 3 buttons, first and last to be 1cm, 0.5in from ei-

ther end, remaining button midway between.

Buttonhole Band (Make 2)

Work as given for Button Band but making buttonholes to match markers on right side rows as follows.

K2, P1, K2tog, yfwd, rib to end.

Sew on buttons.

BOY'S DUNGAREES




Using 3.25mm needles and M, cast on 21 (23, 25)sts.

Next row (rs) - K1, * P1, K1, rept from * to end.

Complete as given for Girl's Dungarees from ★ to end.

SWISS DARNING

Thread a yarn needle with required colour, trace along row of stitches as shown in the diagram. This is worked over the garment once it is completed, but gives the appearance of fair isle knitting.
