## Chunky Moss Stitch Cushion

## Size

Width $14 \mathrm{in} / 35 \mathrm{~cm}$
Length $14 \mathrm{in} / 35 \mathrm{~cm}$

Square measures $2 \operatorname{lin} \times 2 \operatorname{lin}(54 \mathrm{~cm} \times 54 \mathrm{~cm})$
You will need;

7mm Crochet Hook

Cushion Pad I4in $\times 14$ in ( $35 \mathrm{~cm} \times 35 \mathrm{~cm}$ )
You will also need scissors and a darning needle for sewing up your cushion

## Gauge (Tension)

Rows I-3 of pattern make square measuring $3 \mathrm{in} \times 3 \mathrm{in}(7.7 \mathrm{~cm} \times 7.7 \mathrm{~cm})$

## Abbreviations (UK Terms)

ch - chain; dc - double crochet (US = sc single crochet); tr - treble (US = dc double crochet); sl st slip stitch; chl-sp - chain one space; ch3-sp - chain three space; sk st - skip next stitch, st(s) - stitch(es)

## Pattern Instructions

This pattern is made working in rounds with the right side of the work always facing you. Do not turn the square over between rounds but keep the right side facing you when joining new yarn colours each round.

Round I: With Yarn A make a magic circle, ch3 (counts as first tr), 2 tr into circle, ch3, *3tr into circle, ch3**, repeat from * to ${ }^{* *} 2$ more times, sl st into top of starting ch3 to join. Fasten off Yarn A.

Round 2: Join Yarn B on to 2nd tr along side of the square. Ch2 (counts as Idc and I ch), sk st, *(Idc, ch3, Idc) into ch3-sp, chl, sk st, Idc into 2nd tr along side of square, chl, sk st**, repeat * to ** 2 more times, (Idc, ch3, Idc) into ch3-sp, ch I, sk st, sl st into first ch of starting ch2 to join. Fasten off yarn B.


Round 3: Join Yarn C on to first chl-sp along side of the square. Ch2 (counts as Idc and I ch), *[Idc in next chl-sp, chl] until end of side, (Idc, ch3, Idc) into ch3-sp, chl ${ }^{* *}$, repeat * to ${ }^{* *} 3$ more times, sl st into first ch of starting ch2 to join. Fasten off yarn C.


Round 4: Join Yarn D on to first chl-sp along side of the square. Ch2 (counts as Idc and I ch), *[Idc in next chl-sp, chl] until end of side, (Idc, ch3, Idc) into ch3-sp, chl ${ }^{* *}$, repeat * to ** 3 more times, sl st into first ch of starting ch2 to join. Fasten off yarn D.


Round 5: Repeat round 4 instructions using yarn E . Fasten off yarn E.


Round 6: Repeat round 4 instructions using yarn F . Fasten off yarn F.


Round 7: Repeat round 4 instructions using yarn G. Fasten off yarn G.


Round 8: Repeat round 4 instructions using yarn H . Fasten off yarn H.


Round 9: Join Yarn A on to first ch l-sp along side of the square. Ch3 (counts as Itr), Itr
in same chl-sp, *[2tr in next chl-sp] until end of side, (2tr, ch3, 2tr) in ch3-sp**, repeat * to ** 3 more times, sl st into top of starting ch3 to join. Fasten off yarn A.


Round IO: Join Yarn C on to 2 nd tr along side of the square. Ch2 (counts as Idc and I ch), sk st, *[Idc, chl, sk st] until last stitch of side, Idc in last st, ch I, (Idc, ch3, Idc) into ch3-sp, ch I, sk st ${ }^{* *}$, repeat * to ${ }^{* *} 3$ more times, sl st into first ch of starting ch2 to join. Fasten off yarn C.


Round II: Repeat round 4 instructions using yarn D. Fasten off yarn D.

Round I 2: Repeat round 4 instructions using yarn E. Fasten off yarn E.

Round I4: Repeat round 4 instructions using yarn G. Fasten off yarn G.

Round I5: Repeat round 4 instructions using yarn H . Fasten off yarn H.

Round I6: Repeat round 4 instructions using yarn $B$. Fasten off yarn B.

Round I7: Repeat round 9 instructions using yarn $A$.
Round I8: Repeat round 10 instructions using yarn D. Fasten off yarn D.

Round I9: Repeat round 4 instructions using yarn E . Fasten off yarn E.

Round 20: Repeat round 4 instructions using yarn F. Fasten off yarn F.

Round 21: Repeat round 4 instructions using yarn G. Fasten off yarn G.

Round 22: Repeat round 4 instructions using yarn H . Fasten off yarn H.

Round 23: Repeat round 4 instructions using yarn $B$. Fasten off yarn B.

Round 24: Repeat round 4 instructions using yarn C. Fasten off yarn C.

Round 25: Repeat round 9 instructions., using yarn A.
Round 26: Repeat round 10 instructions using yarn E . Fasten off yarn E.

Round 27: Repeat round 4 instructions using yarn $F$.
Fasten off yarn F.

Round 28: Repeat round 4 instructions using yarn G. Fasten off yarn G.

Round 29: Repeat round 4 instructions using yarn H . Fasten off yarn H.

Round 30: Repeat round 4 instructions using yarn $B$. Fasten off yarn B.

Round 3 I: Repeat round 4 instructions using yarn C. Fasten off yarn C.

Round 32: Repeat round 4 instructions using yarn D. Fasten off yarn D.

Round I3: Repeat round 4 instructions using yarn F.

Round 33: Join Yarn A on to first chl-sp along side of the square. ChI (counts as Idc), Idc in same chl-sp, *[2dc in next chl-sp] until end of side, 3 dc in ch3-sp**, repeat * to ${ }^{* *} 3$ more times, sl st into starting chl to join. Fasten off yarn A.

## Making up instructions

Lay your giant crochet square flat on a surface so the right side is facing down and you can see the wrong side.
Place the cushion pad in the centre of the crochet square at an angle so that it looks like a diamond and the corner points of the cushion pad touch the middle of each edge of the giant crochet square.

Fold the corners of the giant crochet square over the cushion pad so that the four corners meet in the middle. You may wish to secure the four corners together in the middle with a stitch marker (or safety pin) whilst you sew up.


Sew the edges of the giant crochet square together using whip stitch, working from one of the newly formed corner points of your cushion straight across to the opposite side of the
cushion. Match your 2dc groups together as you go, sewing through the tops of each matching stitch. Repeat this process to sew the remaining edges together.

Optional Extra: You could sew in a zip at this point if you'd like to be able to remove your cushion cover.
Sew in any remaining ends. This completes your cushion.

## Matching blanket option

You could make a matching blanket for your cushion using this pattern to make a giant granny square blanket. To do this after round 32 go back to round 25 instructions and keep working from round 25 to 32 on repeat until you have a blanket that is your required size. You will need to alternate the starting colour for each round of moss stitch as you have been doing in the pattern so far. Once you have reached the required size of your blanket, do one final round following round 33 instructions.
