ABBREVIATIONS

K - Knit; **P** - Purl; **st(s)** - stitch(es); **rept** - repeat; **patt** - pattern; **inc** - increase; **dec** - decrease; **beg** - beginning; **alt** - alternate; **sl** - slip; **MI** - make one, pick up loop before next st and knit it through back of loop; **0** - no stitches or rows to be worked in that particular size; **tog** - together; **cm** - centimetres; ins - inches; **st st** - stocking stitch (1 row knit, 1 row purl); **yrn** - yarn round needle; **rs** - right side; **ws** - wrong side; **C4B** - slip next 2 sts onto cable needle and leave at back of work, K2, then K2 from cable needle.

TENSION

It is important to check your tension before commencing the garment. 10sts and 14rows to 10cm (4ins) over st st on 10mm needles. If there are too many stitches to 10cm, then your tension is tight and you will need to change your needle to a larger size. If there are too few stitches to 10cm, then your tension is loose and you will need to change your needle to a smaller size.

COMMENCE PATTERN

BERET

Using 9mm needles, cast on 45 sts.

1st row - (rs) K1, *P1, K1, rept from * to end.

2nd row - P1, *K1, P1, rept from * to end.

Rept these 2 rows once more, ending with a ws row.

Change to 10mm needles.

Next row - (rs) inc once in each of first 44 sts, K1. 89 sts.

Cont in cable patt as follows:-

1st row - (ws) P1, [P5, K1, P4, K1] 8 times.

2nd row - [P1, C4B, P1, K5] 8 times, K1.

3rd row - as 1st row.

4th row - [P1, K4, P1, K5] 8 times, K1.

These 4 rows form cable patt.

Work in cable patt for a further 7

rows, ending with a ws row.

Shape top

1st row - (rs) [P1, K4, P1, K3, K2tog] 8 times, K1. 81 sts.

2nd row - P1, [P4, K1] 16 times.

3rd row - [P1, C4B, P1, K4] 8 times, K1.

4th row - as 2nd row.

5th row - [P1, K4, P1, K2, K2tog] 8 times, K1. 73 sts.

6th row - P1, [P3, K1, P4, K1] 8 times.

7th row - [P1, C4B, P1, K1, K2tog] 8 times, K1. 65 sts.

8th row - P1, [P2, K1, P4, K1] 8 times.

9th row - [P1, K4, P1, K2tog] 8 times, K1. 57 sts.

10th row - P1, [P1, K1, P4, K1] 8 times.

11th row - [P1, C4B, K2tog] 8 times, K1. 49 sts.

12th row - P1, [P5, K1] 8 times.

13th row - [P1, K3, K2tog] 8 times, K1. 41 sts.

14th row - P1, [P3, P2tog] 8 times. 33 sts.

15th row - [K2, K2tog] 8 times, K1. 25 sts.

16th row - P1, [P2tog, P1] 8 times. 17 sts.

17th row - [K2tog] 8 times, K1. Break yarn and thread through rem 9 sts. Pull up tight and fasten off securely.

MAKING UP

Join back seam by top sewing.

SCARF

Using 10mm needles, cast on 20 sts.

1st row - (rs) K1, [P1, inc once in each of next 2 sts, P1, K3] twice, P1, inc once in each of next 2 sts, P1, K1. 26 sts.

Cont in cable patt as follows:-

1st row - (ws) K2 [P4, K1, P3, K1] twice, P4, K2.

2nd row - K1, [P1, C4B, P1, K3] twice, P1, C4B, P1, K1.

3rd row - as 1st row.

4th row - K1, [P1, K4, P1, K3] twice, P1, K4, P1, K1.

These 4 rows form cable patt.

Cont in cable patt until Scarf

measures 200cm (78³/₄ins), ending with a rs row.

Next row - (ws) K2, [P2tog, P2tog, K1, P3, K1] twice, [P2tog] twice, K2.

Cast off rem 20 sts in patt.

MAKING UP

Run gathering threads along cast-on and cast-off edges, then pull up tight to gather ends of Scarf. Make two 9 cm (3.5ins) diameter pompoms and attach one to each end of Scarf.



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
